Sterling and Gail Smith purchased the old Sanborn farm in South Dover in 1978. They raised potatoes and small grains along with four boys, Blake, Roger, Michael, and Trent. It quickly became known as Windy Knoll Farm to the family for the wind never stops blowing. Blake and his wife, Stephanie, became part of the management team in 1999.

This year the farm is growing about 200 acres of potatoes, 450 acres of corn, 350 acres of grass, and 25 acres of small grains. The potatoes will go to Utz Quality Foods for potato chips. The corn and grass are contracted to a local dairy farm. Presently the Smith family is farming in Dover-Foxcroft, Atkinson, and the Newport area. The farm currently has three generations involved with Blake and Stephanie's sons, Kaleb, 16 and Drew, 14.
